I. Alternative submission method

If you encounter technical difficulties or are unable to access the on-line submission form from your location, please submit your proposal via E-mail to siel2018@wcl.american.edu following these instructions:

- 1) Please write “SIEL 2018 CFP” in the subject of the email, followed by “paper”, “panel” or “poster” proposal
- 2) In the body of the e-mail please write the following
 - a. Your full name, title, institutional affiliation and position
 - b. If you are currently a Ph.D. student, state so and indicate your university and supervisor
 - c. Indicate the title of your proposal
 - d. Indicate the subfield of IEL which must be one of the following: “trade”, “investment”, “finance/monetary”, “intellectual property”, or “development”
 - e. whether or not your submission fits within the Conference Theme
 - f. indicate whether your project has already been published.
- 3) Attach to this e-mail your proposal
 - a. For paper / poster proposals this must be a WORD file (in docx format) with a maximum of 3500 characters. The abstract must **not** include any details identifying the proposer or any metadata, but should contain the title of the paper.
 - b. For panel proposals, two separate word documents are required:
 - i. a document containing a panel title and a short description of the topics covered during the panel, and
 - ii. a document listing suggested panelists (no more than 5, which includes moderators, commentators and discussants), including concise information about the panelists and their specific contribution to the panel, for example as a presenter of a paper or as a participant serving a different role. Suggested panelists must have been consulted by the organizer of the panel about the proposal. They must have confirmed their interest in serving on such a panel if it were to be selected and must have agreed to come in person to Washington. Please take into account the diversity of speakers and opinions reflected in your panel proposal. In assessing and selecting panel proposals, the conference

organizers may take into account the diversity of speakers and the originality and topicality of the panel's topic and presentations.

II. Alternative method to apply for a scholarship

If you are unable (e.g. through the support or assistance of your employer/institution) to partially or fully finance your participation in the conference, you may apply for funding. Note that to apply for funding you must be from a developing country (i.e. working in a developing country, but not for an international organization). You must submit an additional word file with the following information:

- 1) Employer's name and address
- 2) What is your employer's policy regarding providing funding to attend conferences? (e.g. will cover airfare but not hotel; never provides any funding; will provide up to x amount...)
- 3) Amount of funding available to you (from your employer or other sources) in \$ (please also indicate if you are unable to apply for funds from your institution until your proposal is accepted)
- 4) Current cost of cheapest economy-class airline ticket from your location to Washington D.C. (in \$)
- 5) Do you have contacts you can stay with in Washington or will you require commercial lodging?
- 6) Assuming SIEL is able to provide you with some amount of funding after the conference, are you able to initially cover the costs of getting yourself to Washington D.C. (i.e. to purchase your own airline ticket and pay your hotel bill)?
